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1. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

1.1 INTRODUCTION

Bhagwantrao Shivaji Patil Mahavidyalaya, Paratwada was established in 1969 by Bharatiya Vidya Mandir, Amravati. Bharatiya Vidya Mandir Amravati is an organization formed by renowned teachers to disseminate value based education and uplift the tribal and rural masses for their all round development. The college was established in response to the needs of the young generation of tribal in Melghat and poor downtrodden inhabitants of the Achalpur Tehsil, who had no hope of higher education. The college is fulfilling its mission of creating educational environment for the holistic development of tribal and rural masses under the guidance of Bharatiya Vidya Mandir, Amravati Principal, Teaching and non-teaching staff. The college properly represents all stake holders on various committees and encourages them to participate in all activities.

Our college is permanently affiliated to Sant Gadge Baba Amravati University, Amravati. The college is a renowned centre of academic excellence in

Amravati district located in 3.5 acres of green campus. This green campus of the college provide students with beautiful environment for study and promotes learning and all activities with full concentration. The campus beautification is maintained through the proper establishment of infrastructural facilities and planting different trees in the college campus. Ample number of trees have been planted to conserve the natural beauty. The college conduct Green Audit every year.

The college offers 02 undergraduate and 05 post-graduate, 01 research 01 UGC Recognized Certificate, 33 Add On Certificate Programmes in the faculties of Arts and Commerce. The college runs junior college and H.S.C vocational courses in the campus. The college began with the rented infrastructure, few facilities and students. Today, almost 1446 students are admitted for various courses in the college. The college provides facilities like smart classrooms, audio visual equipments, sufficient numbers of computers, printers and scanners for effective curriculum delivery. The college is recognized research centre in commerce by the parent university. The college has a highly qualified teachers who are well known experts in their respective subjects. The faculty members of our college discharge their duties with a sense of devotion. The college library has 26066 books and other E-resources.

- Well organized induction programmes.

Institutional Challenge

- Diverse tribal and linguistic scenario of the region makes it difficult to acquire the communication skills in English, Hindi and Marathi.
- All post-graduate and some UG programmes are permanently on no grant basis.
- There are difficulties in communication with the tribal students living in remote areas of Melghat.
- Placement of students in Industries and corporate houses.

1.3 CRITERIA WISE SUMMARY

Curricular Aspects

The college is affiliated to Sant Gadge Baba Amravati University, Amravati, therefore the college follows the syllabus developed by the affiliating university. The college conducts teaching and other activities as per the syllabus designed by the university which is based on UGC guidelines. The college conduct many activities and develop strategies for the proper implementation of the curriculum. It makes us to achieve the objectives. The IQAC and the academic calendar committee prepares the academic calendar as per the instructions of the parent university in the beginning of the session. The feedback committee takes regular feedback from the stake holders for the better implementation of the academic activities. The head of the departments monitor the proper implementation of academic plan and co-curricular, extracurricular activities. The college uses effective teaching strategies and ICT facilities for the proper delivery of curriculum. The college holds seminars, conferences and workshops to fulfill the objectives of the college. The college offers 12 subjects in the BA programme, 40 subjects in the B.com programme. The college also runs 5 PG courses. The college takes care of skill based activities for the computer skill, communication skill and vocational skill through the practical based knowledge. The college develops the environmental sense among the students of all faculty and courses. The IQAC regularly conducts Academic Audit and has strengthened the feedback mechanism. The IQAC concentrated on the University Result and 16 students have ranked in the university merit list in the last five years.

The college runs equal opportunity cell and remedial classes for the weak students and encourage them to take projects. The college has a tribal student cell which looks after the all-round personality development of the tribal students.

Teaching-learning and Evaluation

The college feeds the academic needs of the people including poor and downtrodden tribal inhabitants in the Melghat. The college pays proper attention to the government and university rules and regulations. The average percentage of admissions filled against reserved categories is 100%. The college takes care of reservation policies of the government. The college has the proper mechanism to identify slow and advanced learners. The remedial cell and the departments of the college takes necessary steps to ensure the effecting learning of slow learners. The cell conducts remedial lectures for slow learners and encourages advanced learners to participate in different activities.

The department takes care of the students from diverse linguistic background, for these the college has different mechanisms such as experiential teaching-learning, problem solving method and participative learning. The college assigns project work to the students and organizes field visits. The students participate in the activities like class seminars, debates, quiz and group discussion. The departments use ICT facilities in teaching-learning process which help the students to enhance the quality of teaching and learning. The IQAC has established mentor-mentee system for this purpose.

Average pass percentage of the students is 75.77% during the last five years. 16 students have secured

university position in the last five years. The college conducts induction programme regularly and communicates programme and course outcomes to the students.

There are 04 NET/SET qualified faculty members, 07 faculty members having PhD degree, 06 faculty members having M.Phil degree and 01 faculty member is pursuing PhD. The college motivates faculty members for quality education and capacity building.

The college has an Internal Examination Committee which effectively monitors the timely implementation of the internal examination. The process of examination and evaluation is transparent and the students complaint regarding form submission, Hall ticket and Witheld result are addressed at university level. The faculty members use ICT facilities in teaching and the college has developed 3 ICT enabled classrooms.

Research, Innovations and Extension

The Research Committee of the college motivates the faculty members and the students for the promotion of research culture. The college provides ICT facilities to the students and faculty members for undertaking research. The college encourages faculty members for presenting papers at university state, national and international level conferences. The departments of the college organize seminars and conferences in collaboration with other institute. The college encourages the faculty members to prepare and submit research proposal for minor and major research projects. 07 faculty members out of 12 are PhD holders. 03 faculty members are research guides. 01 faculty members are pursuing PhD degree. 07 minor research projects are completed by faculty members. 80 research papers in UGC recognized journals and 80 research papers in national and international journals were published in the last five years. The faculty members published 55 books during last five years. The college has signed 14 MOU with different institutes. The NSS unit of the college adopts tribal village and conducts a residential camp there. The NSS unit tries to solve tribal problems enthusiastically. The tribal cell of the college monitors the activities of the tribal students throughout the sessions.

The college provides all types of facilities to the researchers and volunteers of the NSS unit. The college remains always in the forefront in the field of regular extension activities through NSS unit. The college has 08 functional MOUs for conducting collaborative activities.

The IQAC motivated faculty members and students to undertake research activities. The college has established one Research Centre in Commerce. The faculty members published quality research papers in journals established linkages and MOU with the other institutes. As per the recommendation of NAAC Peer Team 2015, we provide more research facilities both to the teachers and students. The college has established collaborations with Industries.

Infrastructure and Learning Resources

The college has well built infrastructure with the facilities like sufficient number of classrooms, Spacious administrative blocks, separate offices for the principal, IQAC, NSS, the placement cell, well furnished language, computer and home-economics laboratories, drinking water facilities, separate common rooms for boys and girls and toilet blocks. The college takes optimal use of these facilities for academic and other activities. The college has 25 classrooms out of which 03 classrooms are well equipped with the ICT equipments for digital delivery. Each department has been provided with computer, requisite software and Wi-Fi facility for carrying out academic and other works. The college has 92 computers for the educational use for the students and teachers. The college has outdoor sports facilities. The college motivates tribal students to participate in sports activities.

The library has a collection of 26066 books and textbooks, and 150 CDs and DVDs of different programmes and lectures. The library provides reading room facility to the faculty members and the students. The library provides N-list for online learning resources. The college regularly upgrades IT facilities including Wi-Fi. The college provides sufficient number of printers, scanners, LCD projectors, Photocopiers and different software. Student-Computer ratio of the college is 1:15 and bandwidth of the internet connection is >50 MBPS. The college signs various contracts for maintaining these physical facilities. Sufficient fund is allocated for regular maintenance of the infrastructure.

Student Support and Progression

The college undertakes students centric activities and provides all types of support to the students. The college gives financial assistance to tribal students, physically challenged students, economically backward students in the form of concessions, scholarships and cash prizes. The college provides TA, DA and kit to the students participating in university, state and national level, sports and cultural competitions.

The college organizes study tours, field visits, bank visits and industrial visits. The placement cell of the college organize guest lectures on the competitive examination guidance regularly. The college publishes the annual magazine named "Sungandha". Our annual magazine is a platform for students to express their artistic creativity in the form of articles, short stories and poems. Our college magazine has regular been awarded by the SGB Amravati University. The departments organize guest lectures on entrepreneurship development, career opportunities, banking, etc. The college has Grievance Redressal Cell to solve the complaints of students. The faculty members balances a repo of communication and counseling with the students. The college has installed CCTV cameras in the campus. The Tribal Student cell motivates the tribal students to bring them in the mainstream of the society. The alumni Association of the college plays an important role in shaping the personality of the students.

The college always endures for students progression to higher studies. In tune with the vision and mission of the college, the teachers encourage students to participate in all types of activities. 16 students secured their position in the merit list of the university during last five years. 23 students have own awards and medals for

their outstanding performance in sports and cultural activities. The college appoints a students on various decision making committees of the college like CDC and IQAC. As per the recommendation of NAAC PEER Team, the college has developed Entrepreneurship Development Cell. Career Guidance and Coaching Cell is working hard to create more capable personnel. The Library has purchased more books and offered more facilities to the students.

Governance, Leadership and Management

The governing body of the college fosters the spirit of participative management and meets regularly to approve the strategic plan and the budget of the college. The governing body takes the review of the academic decisions, finance, disciplinary and other committees. The faculty members and the members of the administrative wing of the college work as the members of decision making bodies. The college believes in decentralization and participative governance. The executive council, CDC, Principal, IQAC and the teachers plays an important role in the planning and execution of its quality policies in teaching learning research and extension activities.

- 1. Our adopted villages have become 100% liquor free villages.
- 2. Self-help groups are formed.
- 3. The Dept. of HEC has organized various workshops for women on the preparation of nutritional dishes.
- 4. Medical camps and distribution of clothes have created awareness about health and cleanliness.
- 5. Malnutrition grade is decreased and infant mortality rate is lowered in our adopted villages.
- 6. People have started sowing indigenous crops and become aware about the conservation of medicinal plants.

6. Problems Encountered and Resources Required

The college uses NSS grants for this purpose. Moreover we collect clothes, medicines and other things from the local urban society. Tribal obstinacy was the main hindrance but nowadays we have developed a sense of collaboration among students and tribal people.

As per the vision statement of the institution we are working in right direction to uplift the society. The most important thing is that in spite of hindrances we have not given up our efforts to uplift the tribal through NSS for Tribal Awareness.

1. Title of the Practice

Slum Attachment To Lift Values And Education (SALVE).

2. Objectives of the Practice

- To create educational opportunities for the youngsters living in slum near the college.
- To organize classes to give them formal education.
- To provide sports and games equipments in the campus.
- To provide them multimedia facilities in the campus.
- To provide them uniform and breakfast.
- To provide the drinking water.

3. The Context

Considering the role of Education institute to uplift the society especially the people who are neglected, we made survey of the slum area adjoining our campus. We realized that nearly 100% parents were illiterate. Even their wards were not admitted to any schools even for primary education. One of our non-teaching staff along with the teaching staff visited their zuggis and informed them about our plan. They showed concern for the education of their children.

Initially we conducted the meeting of parents and convinced them the importance of education. The incharge of this best practice created awareness among slum dwellers about the health, education, cleanliness etc. The parents responded well and started sending their children in the college campus. The college initiated a well designed plan for their education, sports activities, health and hygiene and diet.

4. The Practice

The newly admitted girls and boys were given orientation in the first week of the academic session. The NSS officer and selected volunteers shouldered the responsibility of this practice. The slum children are motivated to imbibe values and continue their school education. They are regularly provided bath soaps and lessons on cleanliness. Our volunteers invite barbers for shaping their hair cuts and form their external personality. Medical check-up camps are organized to enhance the importance of health issues. The sports material is provided to the children so that they can have a recreation. Most of the parents of the children are Rickshaw pullers, Rag pickers and labours who cannot take proper care of their children and cannot shoulder the financial responsibility of their education. The children learn etiquettes, self introduction and storytelling. They are regularly provided breakfast and clothes. Most of these students learn national anthem and undergo tremendous changes in their behaviour. We give preference to grooming activities which help them to gain confidence.

Our aim is not to educate them to pass the examination but to cultivate in them good habits and manners. We involve them in group interaction and it is an evidence of success that they participate in the group activities.

5. Evidence of Success

The NSS officer and Volunteers watch the changes in their behavior after the parents meet at counseling. The attendance of these children is increasing gradually. Initially the parents used to refuse to sent their children to the college campus because all these children were basically earning loaf of bread for their family through fair and foul means. Change is visible in the students as they are keen to learn new things and activities. Now they can understand the news bulletins, serials or the simple difference between the games like Kabaddi and Kho-Kho.

6. Problems Encountered and Resources Required

Resource and finances was never hindrance for us in running this scheme. The teaching and non-teaching staff of the college have contributed to run this scheme. We are satisfied with our efforts and the scheme in running successfully in our college.

As per the vision statement of the institution we are working in right direction to uplift the society. The most important thing is that in spite of hindrances we have not given up our efforts to uplift the slum dwellers.
